Is Private Really Private???

These days, more and more people are connecting with each other via text messaging, Facebook, Twitter, social blogs and more. It all seems pretty harmless, and the more comfortable we become with the technology, the more we seem to open ourselves up and share personal details and information as we interact with others. But, what we need to remember and ask ourselves is ... are we sharing too much information ... and is private really private in cyberspace and over the airwaves?

Today, we live in a world of technology. Computers, cell phones and tablets are everywhere and owned by almost everyone. Because of this, we can get a false sense of security and privacy. For instance, teenagers use text messaging as the main source of communication between one another. Many teens, and even some adults, don't realize that text messages sent privately to each other on their phones can be snap-shot on the phones, copied or forwarded on and sent to others very quickly and easily. Sud-

denly, that message is not private anymore and seen by many!

College recruiters and admissions personnel have realized the gold mine of information that can be found on applicants on the Internet. Sometimes, simply viewing a prospective student's Facebook page can give recruiters enough information on the student to think twice about them. Photos of a wild party they attended, friends posts in which they were tagged, inappropriate comments and other information can play havoc on young people as they apply to colleges, apply for jobs and try to advance in life. Even photos or comments that a person thought were deleted can come back in the future to haunt them. There is always a chance that someone may have seen it and copied or reposted it before it was deleted ... and you may not have even known it until it surfaces again later on. Ouch!

Think about it, even every time we use a credit card to make a purchase online, a retail store and the credit card company both have collected data on our spending habits and our likes and dislikes-just that quickly. And, what if an Internet hacker breeches security measures and happens to get the credit card information without your knowledge? What a nightmare that can be!

The government even uses supposedly private information for purposes we may not even realize. The drivers' license databases are a prime example. We have a

TV Programming Negotiations End... New Agreement Establishes Fairer Rates

XIT Telecommunication & Technology, Ltd., d.b.a., XIT Communications, is a member of the National Cable Television Cooperative (NCTC), which represents a group of small, independent cable operators to obtain a more competitive pricing on TV programming content. Every year, contracts with different programmers (e.g. Fox, NBC Networks, Turner Networks, Viacom) expire and need to be renegotiated. Negotiations typically begin with programmers proposing exorbitant per subscriber fees. If these fees are not agreed to and paid, programmers threaten to withdraw their programming signals.

You may have heard of TV providers choosing to drop certain networks altogether rather than meet programmers' demands. XIT, as your local provider, along with the NCTC, fight for reasonable fees because we believe the content is invaluable to

you, our customer.

Recently, you may have heard about XIT/NCTC's discussions with Viacom, the owner of cable networks such as Nickelodeon, MTV, Comedy Central and many others. We prefer to not involve our customers in private business negotiations, but Viacom was threatening to pull their channels from some of the cable operators who were seeking fair rates from them. Viacom had demanded a rate increase that was 40 times the rate of inflation for these networks. Imagine pulling up to the gas pump and finding that gas has gone from \$3.50 a gallon to \$6.00 – overnight. That is the scale of some of these large increases! Significant network fee increases directly impact your bill, and rest assured – XIT is on your side to keep these fees low as possible!

During negotiations, you may have seen messages scrolled on the bottom of your TV screens or cross-channel spots on certain channels. Often, when providers, like XIT, don't agree to a network's demands during negotiations, the networks will threaten to or actually pull their signal from the provider to improve their leverage. These messages were "totally false" and "totally misrepresented" the negotiations and were meant to only put pressure on the TV providers, like XIT, to accept outrageous rate increases

or face losing their customers in the confusion.

XIT asks that when you see messages like this that you contact XIT directly to get the facts on what is actually occurring, and give us a chance to answer any questions that you may have. Remember, also, to get the facts and be informed whenever there is a TV network dispute, or service issue, you can tune to XIT's Channel I. The message will appear at the bottom of the screen.

In this instance, many long hours of negotiations ended with a new agreement and fairer rates than what were initially proposed. As a small, local business, XIT appreciates our customers' loyalty and patience as we worked to come to this agreement

with the MTV Networks.

When the negotiations were completed between Viacom's Media Networks and NCTC, carriage was renewed not only for XIT, but 799 other NCTC member companies affecting over five million TV customers nationwide.

Children and Computers

 time out from the computer to socialize with other children, exercise, do homework
 and to just play!

Just like most parents explain to their children that TV commercials are different from the real news, there are also some computer sites that exist mainly to sell products to kids or deceive, and are not necessarily trustworthy. Evaluate the information children have encountered while online and take the time to explain if it is something that's not true or real-life.

2 lbs. ground beef
½ lb. Velveeta cheese
2 cans cream of chicken soup

Think Twice Before Ditching Your Landline Phone

We all love to save money, and ditching your landline telephone may sound like a tempting way to do this. If you are like the majority of Americans who use your cell phone most of the time, it seems like one way to put an extra couple bucks back in your pocket. But, don't trade out short-term savings for long-term reliability and safety!

Here are a few reasons why you may want to reconsider cutting off your landline telephone:



- Face it, we live in rural America where cell phone towers are in limited numbers. Chances are many of them are probably older towers at that. If the area would lose one or more cell phone towers in a disaster, you would be out of luck for any communication needs. Blizzards, ice storms and tornadoes can cause holes in cell phone coverage. Also, if too many people are trying to make phone calls at the same time, the towers can't handle the traffic and everything jams up! A landline phone doesn't require towers to work, can operate when the power is off, and the phone cables are usually underground where they are safe. They are much more reliable in a disaster scenario.
- Power outages occur for all of us at one time or another. It is just a fact of life. When
 the power is out, a landline phone connection will work more than 99% of the time.
 It's required by the FCC. This means you can still call 911 or stay in touch with your
 family. During a power outage, cell phone batteries can die, minutes can be used up,
 towers can be down, and lines can be overloaded, which can cause major problems
 when in an emergency situation or family crisis.
- In a medical emergency, 911 finds you when you call from a landline, showing emergency responders exactly what address you are calling from. For babysitters, children and even the elderly, facing an emergency can be scary enough. If the person calling does not know the address, or isn't able to speak for some reason, responders can still answer the call and get to their location quickly. What if you can't find your cell phone, the battery is dead, or you left it in the car? Time is critical in an emergency, and with cell phones

these circumstances can leave you unable to call for help, or could cost you precious time, time that you may not have. Cell phone GPS systems can't compete with the dependability of a landline 911 connection.

- Of course, it's also all about the conversation! A landline call offers the highest quality voice transmission with no dropped calls or half the words cutting out. You get a crystal clear connection 24 hours a day-7 days a week-365 days a year! Landlines also give your call privacy. Cell phones use radio frequencies, which can be tapped into. People listening can then get your credit card information, find out when you'll be away from home, or other information, all while you are talking on a cell phone. It's just not safe!
- Last, but not least, if you have a home security system, chances are it requires an active phone line to call out to the monitoring service if an alarm is triggered. Most home's fire and burglar alarm systems are hardwired into the phone system to automatically alert authorities. Face it, if someone is breaking into your home, having that security is well worth the money!

Keeping the landline phone in the home, just makes good sense! Protect yourself, your family and your property ... it's worth the cost!

driver's license simply to be able to drive legally, but government agencies use the database to know where you reside, if you have car insurance, and they can also use it to track down parents behind on their child support.

Even sitting down at the computer and typing an email to a friend across the country may seem like a very private conversation, but looks can be deceiving. Once the email is sent on the Internet, it is available for others to read. It can be forwarded on very quickly. There is no control over who can intercept and read our private messages without our knowledge.

So, why are we bringing all this up? Simply to remind everyone to think before putting things out over the Internet and air waves. Be cautious, be careful and take a minute to think about what you post and put out there and how it may impact you now, but also later on in the future. It's just that simple! Private may not be all that private!

One last thing to keep in mind ... Cell phone companies keep records of text messages, voice mails and sometimes even pictures on a database in their system. The same is true with telephone and Internet providers. If a communications company, like XIT for example, is subpoenaed by the court for any reason, we are required to provide a copy of the requested information to the court. That is a fact and can't be changed, denied or stopped. And, that my friend, could just be the beginning ...


