Low Income Assistance Available

Assistance for paying your telephone or Internet bill is available to qualifying low-income residents as part of a federal support program called Lifeline. Lifeline is available from XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc. and XIT Communications and provides a monthly discount on basic telephone or Internet service.

- If you use the discount for Internet service, you must subscribe to a 12/2 Mbps or higher Internet package to be eligible for the discount.
- There is only one discount allowed per household for either telephone or Internet, but not for both.
- In order to receive Lifeline assistance, you or someone in your household must participate in at least one of the following programs: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA), Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit Program, or your annual household income must be at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines.
- Customers signing up for Lifeline will be subject to a 60-day port freeze for telephone service, or a 12-month port freeze for broadband Internet service. This means that once you sign up for telephone or Internet service with a provider, you must fulfill the port freeze for the selected service BEFORE changing service to another provider. If you do not fulfill the port freeze requirement, you will lose the Lifeline discount for the remainder of the freeze timeframe. Once the port freeze time requirement has been fulfilled, then you are free to change service providers. There are some exceptions to this rule

including one for customers who move their residential address.

- Subscribers need to recertify once a year.

Call Before You Dig!

As the warmer weather approaches, beautification and yard projects will be in full swing! While working in your yard or alleyway, keep in mind that there are some utility lines that reside underground in your yard and alley. Accidental line cuts can disrupt service not only to you, but even your neighbors, and they can be very expensive to your wallet for the repair costs!



Texas law requires that anyone digging more than 16" on private property or a public right-of-way must call the Texas One Call Center at least two days prior to the start of digging. The statewide telephone number to call is 811. Utility providers will be notified to send employees out to your site to locate the lines and mark them before digging begins. The call is free and remember, it's the law! Know what's below ... call 811 before you dig!

Digital Piracy is Against the Law

Many of us may think if something is on the Internet then it must be ok and legal to use. This includes downloading movies and music ... but this may not necessarily be the case! Please keep in mind that most of the material found on the Internet is copyrighted. Under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA), it is a crime to download any copyrighted material without paying for it. Even if you don't personally download the material, if it were downloaded illegally via your Internet connection, you can still be held legally responsible!



Artists, music and movie companies own the copyrights

to a lot of this desired material. If you are downloading music or movies, and you don't have the permission from the owner, in the eyes of the law you are stealing. If found guilty, you can be required to pay large fines as a result. Keep in mind, even if you purchase content from a legitimate source, you do not have the rights to distribute the content to anyone else. XIT has the right to disconnect Internet service to any customer that is found in violation of the copyright laws.

Copyright owners can identify illegal downloads by the Internet connection's IP address when files are downloaded. Some will even obtain court orders to get the IP log files from other websites that host free copyrighted material downloads. These websites may technically be considered "a legitimate website," but once you download from the site you are in violation of copyright laws, and if caught, you can be prosecuted. It's better to purchase the movies or music you want so it is legal. It may save you a lot of money in legal costs and fees later on!

Hackers seem to be getting into everything these days, and email accounts happen to be one of the most popular! This is because many people do not take the security measures they need to make sure their passwords are secure.



By having a secure password, it helps protect you from hacking and all the costly problems that could arise from it. If you have an XIT email account, please read over this criteria and give us a call if you would like to create a more secure password:

- · Password must be at least 8 characters long
- Must contain an uppercase (capital) letter
- Must contain a lowercase letter
- Must contain a number
- Must contain a special character (#*&@!%)
- Does not contain the user name, real name or company name
- Does not contain a complete word
- · Is significantly different from previous passwords

Also, it is recommended that you don't use the same password for all of your accounts. Numerous apps are available for password creation and upkeep, including ones like Sticky Password, LastPass and Roboform. These systems can generate strong passwords for you and even fill out login pages with the correct password automatically.
