

Lifeline and Link-Up Programs Offer Assistance


XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc. and XIT Communications offers reduced rates to eligible residential consumers under two programs: Lifeline and Linkup. Lifeline provides monthly discounts to an eligible customer's basic local service. Linkup offers eligible customers a reduction in installation charges for telephone service equal to one-half of the service connection charges or \$30.00, whichever is less. Cus-



tomers who are eligible for the Lifeline and Linkup Programs are also eligible for toll blocking at no charge.

To be eligible for Lifeline and Linkup, a customer's annual household income must be at or below 150% of the federal poverty guidelines, or a customer must receive benefits from or have a child in the household who receives benefits from at least one of the following programs: Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (formerly Food Stamps); Supplemental Security Income (SSI); Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA); Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP); or Health benefits coverage under the state Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).





Stopping Junk E-mail Completely

Yes, you read right: You can stop junk e-mail completely. But you must understand how spam filters work in order to make this happen. When idiots first started sending junk e-mail (or spam), there wasn't much you could do except delete it. I would tell people to treat their e-mail inbox just like their real mailbox: sift through the garbage and pull out the legitimate pieces.

However, as the spammers became more prolific, the art of "sifting" took more and more time. So, some ingenious programmer created an automated filtering system, the first spam blocker. It would simply scan all e-mail before it hit your inbox. If it found certain words, the message would be tagged as "spam" and moved to a junk e-mail folder.

Spammers caught on to this strategy and started devising ways around these filters. To this day, a junk e-mail battle continues. Spam filters keep blocking and spammers keep figuring out ways around them. And of course, you are caught in the middle, slowly drowning in a sea of e-mail garbage.

So, someone invented the "black list." Basically, this was a list of known websites and Internet servers that sent junk e-mail. By blocking all mail from these servers, you could reduce junk e-mail to a trickle without looking for trigger words.

But, once again, the spammers figured out a solution: Never send a junk message from the same server twice! And, alas, the good guys started losing again...would the cycle ever be broken?

Yes. Enter, the "White List." Basically, it's the opposite of a black list. Instead of allowing everyone through EXCEPT those on the black list, you are ONLY letting those on the white list reach your inbox. Receiving someone's messages only requires you to add their address to your white list. No spam. None at all.

Fortunately for XIT e-mail customers they have the ability to set their own e-mail "White List" and "Black List" preferences. Just go to http://mail.xit.net; Log in using your full e-mail address and your password; Click on Spam Management, then select the appropriate icon (From: Whitelist, From: Blacklist or Subject: Blacklist) and follow the onscreen instructions. 
out there to students. I would also like to encourage anyone with a chance to visit Washington D.C. to do so because you will see the history that few get to see and have the time of your life, just as I did.
